

Kiuas: Sauna stove

**Löyly:** Steam or vapour created by throwing water on the stones of the stove or the heat, humidity and temperature in the sauna in general.

**Vihta, vasta:** Whisk, made of birch (or similar) twigs. Used for beating the body in the hot room to stimulate the feel of the *löyly*.



# FULBRIGHT FINLAND FOUNDATION Together Shaping the Future

THE FULBRIGHT FINLAND FOUNDATION is an independent not-for-profit based in Helsinki, Finland. With the purpose of promoting a wider exchange of knowledge professional talents educational contacts between Finland and the United States, the Foundation collaborates with a range of government, foundation, university and corporate partners on both sides of the Atlantic to design and manage study and research scholarships, leadership development programs and internationalization services.

**IN 2023** the Fulbright Finland Foundation awarded over EUR 1,7 million as grants to 114 Finnish and American researchers, students, and professionals. Additionally, the Foundation responded to over 5 100 client contacts and organized or participated in over 90 training events throughout Finland and online.

**FOUNDATION** THE **SUPPORTS** the internationalization of education and research in Finland, and helps U.S. and Finnish institutions create linkages. Under its Internationalization Services the Foundation organizes themed study tours to the United States for Finnish higher education experts, runs the highly popular Fulbright Speaker Program, the Fulbright Dialogues series, and the Transatlantic Roundtables, as well as organizes national Fulbright Seminars every year.

**THE FOUNDATION IS FUNDED** by the Finnish Ministry of Education and Culture, the U.S. Department of State, the Finland-America Educational Trust Fund, private foundations, Finnish and U.S. higher education institutions, alumni of the Fulbright Finland programs, and private donors. Nearly 60 % of the Foundation's core funding originates from Finland, and advancement, fundraising and sponsored grants are a central part of the operation. A key strength of the Foundation is the consistent strategic engagement of the alumni.

**OVER 6 200** students, scholars, teachers, artists and professionals have received a grant from the Finnish-American program since its inception in 1949 and the Fulbright Finland Foundation runs an active and rapidly growing alumni network in both countries.

**THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS** of the Fulbright Finland Foundation consists of eight members appointed by the Finnish Ministry of Education and the U.S. Embassy in Finland. The U.S. Ambassador to Finland serves as the Honorary Chair of the Board. The Foundation office is located in Helsinki.

### **ESPOO**

**IN FINLAND** with a population of approximately 320 000 inhabitants. Espoo has five city centers, all of which have their own unique characteristics. In Espoo, you can enjoy Finnish nature in Nuuksio National Park and visit EMMA, the Espoo Museum of Modern Art.

Espoo is home to Aalto University, a multidisciplinary community that


teaches engineering, art, science, and business. In Espoo, learning is valued, and there are around 240 early childhood education centers, 85 comprehensive schools, 19 art schools, 11 general upper secondary schools and three higher education institutes. Espoo is one of the most international cities in Finland with over 150 different nationalities.

### HELSINKI


HELSINKI, THE CAPITAL OF FINLAND, is the administrative center of the country and an important hub of business and culture. Called the "Daughter of the Baltic", Helsinki is located in Southern Finland on the shore of the Gulf of Finland. The population of Helsinki is about 680 000.

Helsinki has several public and private schools, of which nine are international schools. There are a total of nine higher education institutions; four universities and six universities of applied sciences (UAS). These include universities such as the University of Helsinki, Hanken University, Metropolia UAS and Haaga-Helia UAS. Helsinki is also home to one of the largest music academies in Europe, the Sibelius Academy and has one vocational education center where one can study for various professions from car repair to travel services. Some of the most prestigious high schools of Finland are located in Helsinki.

### VANTAA

**VANTAA IS THE FOURTH MOST** populous municipality in Finland. The population consists of 71 % Finnish speakers, 2 % Swedish speakers, and 27 % speakers of other languages, which is well above the national average.

Vantaa offers diverse opportunities in primary, secondary, and vocational education. The city runs a total of 42 Finnish speaking, five Swedish speaking, and one English speaking junior high school.

The Helsinki Airport, situated in Vantaa, serves as the largest airport in Finland and the primary airline hub for the Helsinki metropolitan area. Additionally, Vantaa is home to Heureka, a largest science center in Finland.

### **TURKU**

**TURKUISTHEOLDEST CITY IN FINLAND,** and it served as the capital until 1812. With a population of nearly 200 000, it's the 6th largest city in Finland. The versatile livelihood structure, top class selection of education, culture, and services, as well as the beautiful archipelago, form a magnetic combination in Turku.

Turku has nearly 100 early childhood education centers and nearly 60

comprehensive schools. Turku is a also a large university city with over 40 000 students. Turku has two universities and four universities of applied sciences.

Turku is also a very multicultural city and some 14% of its inhabitants speak something other than Finnish, Swedish or Sámi as their mother tongue.
