

in eastern, northern, and southwestern parts of the country, you will see historical sites and modern treasures of Finland, including the Suomenlinna Sea Fortress, Science Center Heureka, and Oodi, the new Helsinki City Library, that serve as examples of diverse learning environments that play a critical role in the Finnish curriculum.

Throughout the program, you will be able to reflect upon your observations with the expert speakers and with your fellow U.S. Fulbrighters and Fulbright alumni from Finland. You will see in practice that a key strength of the Fulbright Finland Foundation is the strategic engagement of our alumni, and we strongly encourage you to continue your Fulbright experience and connections after your program by becoming active members of the *Friends of Fulbright Finland* (FoFF) alumni network in the U.S.

Together Shaping the Future

The Fulbright Finland Foundation is an independent not-for-profit based in Helsinki, Finland. With the purpose of promoting a wider exchange of knowledge and professional talents through educational contacts between Finland and the United States, the Foundation collaborates with a range of government, foundation, university, and corporate partners on both sides of the Atlantic to design and manage study and research scholarships, leadership development programs and internationalization services.

Funding Cooperation

In 2023, the Fulbright Finland Foundation awarded over EUR 1,9 million as grants to 114 Finnish and American researchers, students, and professionals. Additionally, the Foundation responded to nearly 4 800 client contacts and organized or participated in over 80 training events throughout Finland and online.

The Foundation supports the internationalization of education and research in Finland, and helps U.S. and Finnish institutions create linkages. Under its Internationalization Services the Foundation organizes themed study tours to the United States for Finnish higher education experts, runs the highly popular Fulbright Speaker Program, the Fulbright Dialogues series, and the Transatlantic Roundtables, as well as organizes several national Fulbright Seminars every year.

The Foundation is funded by the Finnish Ministry of Education and Culture, the U.S. Department of State, the Finland-America Educational Trust Fund, private foundations, Finnish and U.S. higher education institutions, alumni of the Fulbright Finland programs, and private donors. 70 % of the Foundation's core funding originates from Finland, and advancement, fundraising and sponsored grants are a central part of the operation. A key strength of the Foundation is the consistent strategic engagement of the alumni.

Growing Alumni Network

Over 6 200 students, scholars, teachers, artists, and professionals have received a grant from the Finnish-American program since its inception in 1949 and the Fulbright Finland Foundation runs an active and rapidly growing alumni network in both countries.

The Board of Directors of the Fulbright Finland Foundation consists of eight members appointed by the Finnish Ministry of Education and the U.S. Embassy in Finland. The U.S. Ambassador to Finland serves as the Honorary Chair of the Board. The Foundation office is located in Helsinki. The Foundation is managed by the CEO together with seven full-time and two part-time staff members.

The Infrastructure of Happiness

Finland is built on trust. This makes us resilient and is a foundation for happiness.

Since 2018, the World Happiness Report has ranked Finland the happiest country in the world. What is Finland's secret? It's the country's infrastructure of happiness. Finnish society is built to allow happiness to thrive. People in Finland have the **personal freedom** to make decisions, to learn and grow, in surroundings that are safe and secure. For recreation, there is an abundance of unspoiled nature to discover.






